PRESSURE ULCER

Use this form to report a pressure ulcer or deep tissue injury that was not present on admission or that worsened during the patient's stay. Report only an event that occurred prior to patient discharge.

Stage 0: No pressure ulcer present.

Stage 1: Intact skin with signs of impending ulceration.

Stage 2: Partial-thickness loss of skin involving epidermis and possibly dermis.

Stage 3: Full-thickness loss of skin with extension into subcutaneous tissue but not through underlying fascia.

Stage 4: Full-thickness loss of skin and subcutaneous tissue and extension into muscle, bone, tendon, or joint capsule.

Unstageable: Full-thickness ulcer covered (obscured) by slough and/or eschar.

Deep tissue injury: Damage of underlying soft tissue from pressure and/or shear, with localized area of discolored intact skin or blood-filled blister, that may rapidly evolve exposing additional layers of tissue even with optimal treatment.
